What is a Temporary Useful Information Token.

What is a Token?

A token is, very simply, a piece of data that stands in for another, more valuable piece of information. Tokens have virtually no value on their own - they are only useful because they represent something bigger. A good analogy is a poker chip: instead of filling a table with wads of cash (which can be easily lost or stolen), players use chips as placeholders. The chips can't be used as money; they must be exchanged for it after the game. Tokenization works by removing the valuable data from your environment and replacing it with these tokens. Most businesses hold at least some sensitive data within their systems, whether it be credit card data, medical information, Social Security numbers, or anything else that requires security and protection. Using tokenization, this data is taken out of your environment entirely, and then it is replaced with tokens that are unique to each piece of information.

The temporary useful information token (tuit) is sort of a mini website that you build ,and it stays available for 7 days then it expires and gets removed. (unless you want to extend its lifespan)

The idea is you upload a photo, fill in the details and share a link on any of the available platforms. Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, WhatsApp, Telegram and the list is endless.

The token can be used to either link to another website, image, page, group, etc.(Url).

Here are some examples that may shed some light on the way they will work

Advertisement with video

Photo montage

Play a game.

Photo Collection

As you can see in the above links, that the token is just a simple quick site, with which to make temporary information available. You as the end user decide where you want it to be shared.
